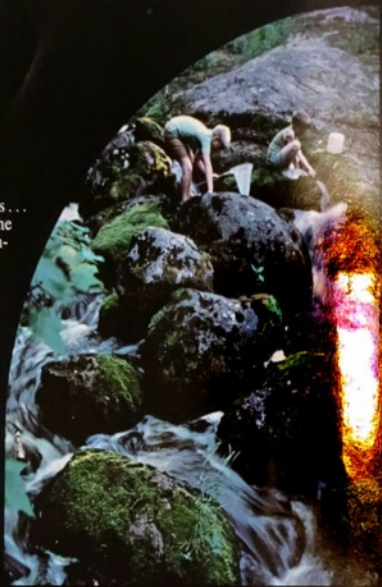

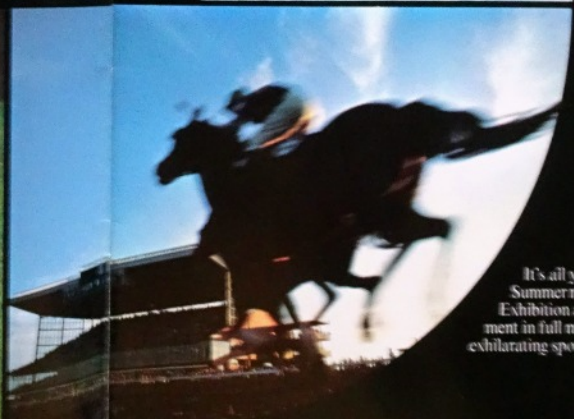
And when you've had your fill, for the time being, of doing and watching, relax and enjoy the delight of fine food.

Manitoba contains some of the best fresh-water vacation land in North America, and, of course, other interesting attractions too.





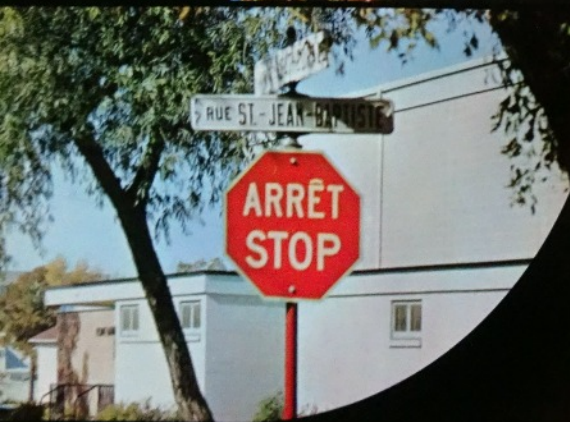
Many different peoples make up the friendly Manitobans. All living it up, all wanting to share their pleasures with you. You're a guest, not a visitor.



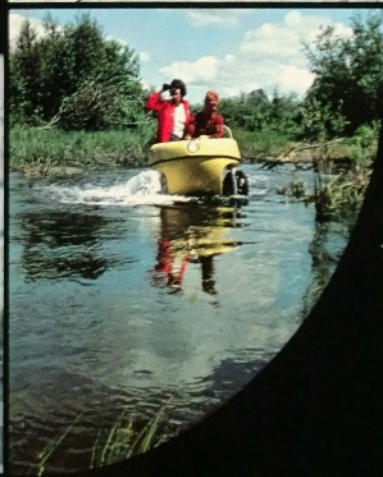

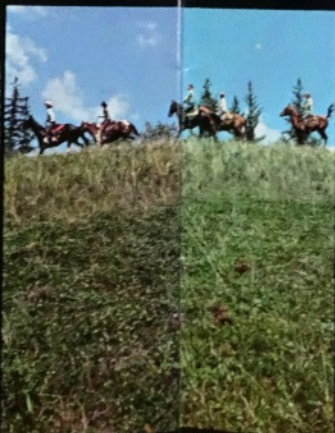
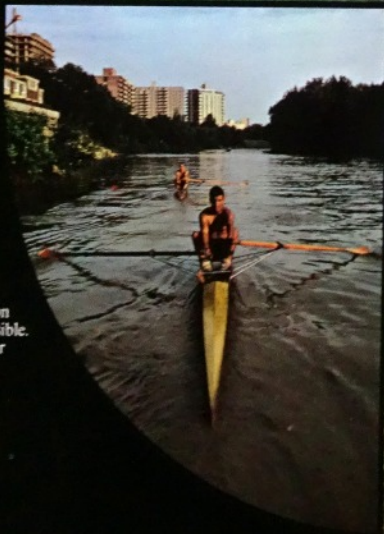


If you get your kicks out of watching other people get their kicks from something more active we have that too.

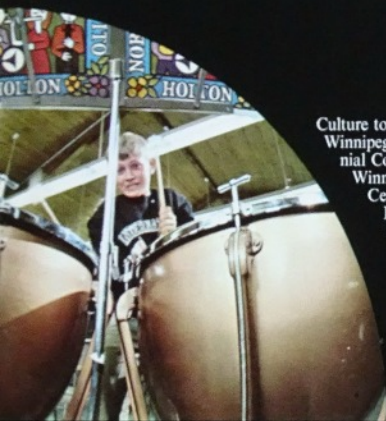

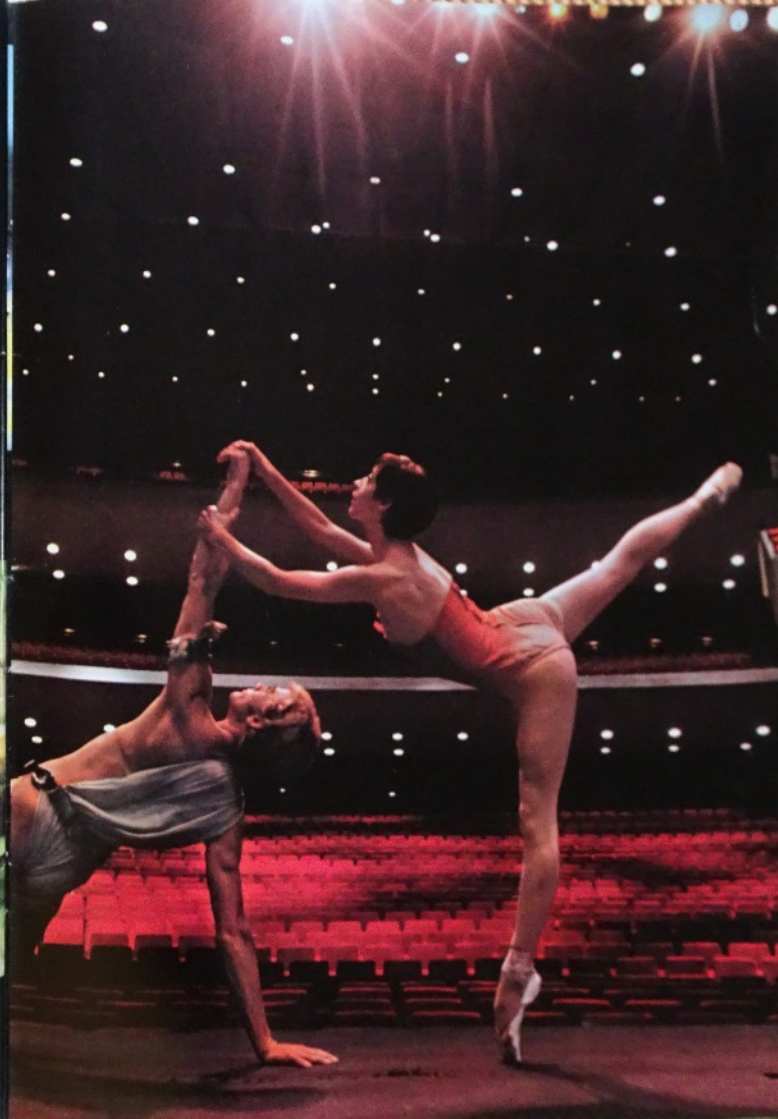
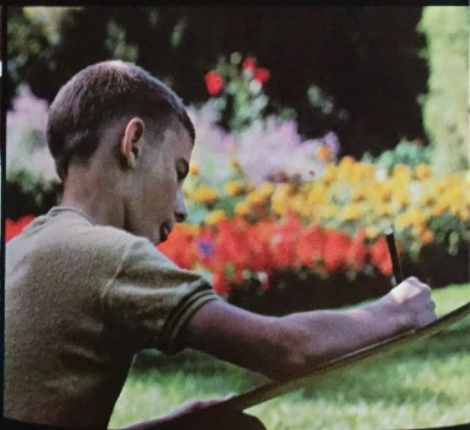
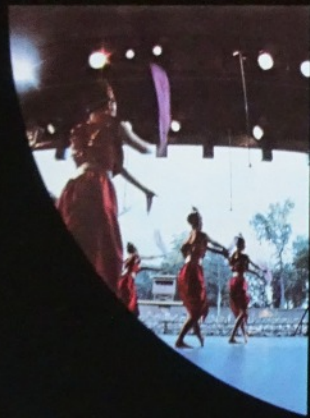
Come to play, come to relax, come to participate or watch. Explore Manitoba for a new vacation adventure.
