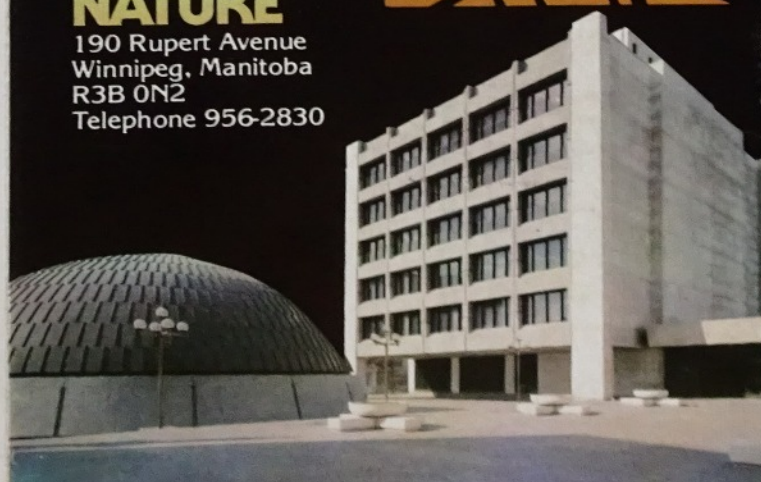

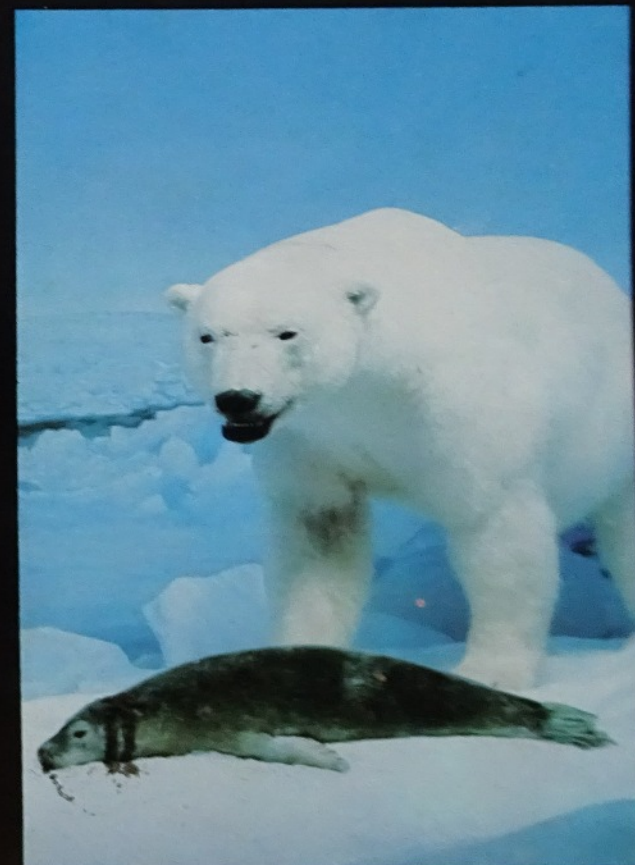

# The MANITOBA MUSEUM of MAN AND NATURE

At the museum, past, present and future become extensions of each other. Move from one dimension to another, and back again, and understand the idea of the continuum which measures our lives.

Begin with a dramatic sight once common to our prairie—a buffalo hunt. Feel the excitement of the chase, stand back and imagine the thundering hoofbeats, the excited cries of the Métis hunters.

Then travel back millions of years to the very beginning of time in the Earth History Gallery. See how the oldest rocks in the world were formed, rocks which can today be found throughout Manitoba.

Feel a slight chill in the air as you enter the frozen quiet of the Arctic-Sub Arctic Gallery. A huge polar bear, symbol of the Arctic, guards the entrance to the gallery. Inside discover the wonder and workings of our northern lights, see a Chipewyan family village, and study the Inuit way of life.

The Glasslands Gallery depicts life on the great prairie. Myriad life forms occupy this sprawling biome, from curious burrowing owls to the prong-horn antelope. Human habitations range from the tipis of the original native peoples through the sod huts and log cabins of the immigrant settlers.

Climb aboard the Nonsuch, a faithful, full-size replica of a famous 17th century sailing ship. Capture a moment over 300 years ago when the Nonsuch sailors left the security of their Thames River port to journey into the unknown.

Take a 1920s walk through the streets of Winnipeg in the Urban Gallery. Peer through windows into typical homes and businesses of the era; listen to the music drawing you into the proscenium theatre.

Glimpse what cities of the future may be like as man rushes forward to the twenty-first century and...

Discover the past that is a part of us all, gain a greater sense of the world around you. Awaken your senses, too, because the Manitoba Museum of Man and Nature is a place to hear, see, touch, smell... and enjoy.
